

PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

I would like to address an unfortunate business issue that has created some angst among our SSR members. Over the past several months, numerous people have been receiving emails from our former webmaster, Frank "Chip" Pecere. Despite our best efforts internally, Mr. Pecere has felt the need to send out rogue and unapproved messages in emails and online social media postings.

Additionally, Mr. Pecere has taken issue with the types of board meetings he can attend. There are Open Board Meetings where any SSR member can attend, Full Board Meetings for all SSR board members and officers, and the Executive Board Meetings where only elected board members (and invited guests) with voting rights may attend. Typically, these meetings deal with very sensitive issues, sometimes disciplinary, and are not for general consumption. Mr. Pecere

was previously allowed into several meetings to report on the status of the website and related issues. At every meeting he has attended, except one, he has been disruptive, including outbursts and not observing the rules for the meeting. Then he put his uninformed and unapproved version of the minutes in these various emails and postings. In July, the SSR had an Executive Board Meeting with Frank Koch (NMRA CFO / AP Chairperson) in attendance. Mr. Pecere jumped onto the meeting knowing he was specifically disallowed as a matter of official business and was not invited. Several board members asked him to leave, and he refused to leave. Frank Koch told him he needed to leave, but Mr. Pecere adamantly refused to leave because he felt he had a right to be there. Subsequently, due to his refusal to follow proper protocol and unprofessional demeanor, Mr. Pecere was removed from his status of Webmaster, an appointed position. It is unfortunate that we had to take this action, but not doing so would be a failure in leadership. You elected me to lead the SSR, and unfortunately, leadership means making tough decisions and at times, meting out discipline to those who cannot follow the rules when required.

Mr. Pecere was instructed to return control of the Web assets to Glenn Kopriva no later than July 12th at 6:00 PM ET but he instead seized the Region's website and refused to return it to the SSR. (The website is a Region asset, and the Region paid for the website through April 2024.) As stated earlier, Mr. Pecere has been removed as the Webmaster for the Region. Mr. Pecere's site (www.sunshineregion.org) **IS NOT** the official Sunshine Region website anymore. If you registered for the 2023 Sunshine Region Convention on Mr. Pecere's website after July 15th, please forward your confirmation email to Glenn Kopriva (glennkopriva@yhaoo.com).

THE CABOOSE CHALLENGE

The Caboose Challenge started when Rich Mahaney (Gobles, Michigan) came down to present 4 clinics at one of our Eastern Division Workshop. When I met Rich, we started talking about how to get more people involved in bringing models to our convention. He told me about a Caboose Challenge they ran for one of their NMRA, North Central Region Conventions, which is centered around the Great Lakes states of Michigan, Ohio, and Indiana. Rich did a Caboose Challenge Presentation at the 2022 SSR Convention Banquet last year, and we had 30+ people immediately accept the challenge. The Caboose Challenge is free and open to anyone coming to the SSR 2023 High Speed Rail Convention in Plant City. Everyone from young to old, NMRA Members, non NMRA Members, you just need to be willing to build a Diorama any size up to 24x24", any Scale (N, HO, S, and O) of a caboose in its "2nd Life After the Railroad". There will be example pictures in the T-Key and on our (SunshineRegion.Org) Website.

The winners will be chosen by a "People's Choice" vote, the Ballot will be in your Goody Bag, so please look for it. There will be 4 prizes to be presented to the winners. The Grand Prize will be a 2024 Convention Registration and Banquet ticket. Second Prize will be a 2024 Banquet ticket, Third Prize will be \$25 off their 2024 Convention Registration, and Fourth Prize will be \$20 off their 2024 Registration. *Disclaimer: Prizes are non-transferrable, non-refundable, and have no cash value.*

There will be a Special Clinic Room set up for display of the Caboose Dioramas. You will need to fill out a Model Entry form as the Model Diorama will only have a number. There will be an early registration drawing, for those who register before Thursday, August 31st, for an Air Brush. So please register as soon as you can, to be entered for this drawing.

Our Convention starts on Thursday morning, October 12th, 2023

With our tour of the Brightline Maintenance facility at the Orlando Airport. Brightline will be getting their FRA Approval in September for full service between Miami and Orlando. For those who are planning to take the tour, please pay attention to the Telegraph Key for any tour changes that may arise. I will also email each of you individually, that are on the tour, on any changes to the tour.

Registration will be open at the hotel between 4-5:00PM and 7-7:30PM.

Thursday evening, there will be an OP Session on Tom Wilson's HO Pittsburg and West Virginia/Union Railroad between 4-9PM, (dinner is included at this OP Session).

REVISED JUDGING GUIDELINES

To be a judge you must meet the following criteria and follow the below rules:

- <u>All judges</u> must attend Judging 101 class.
- Lead judges must attend both Judging 101 and 102 classes
- All AP judging to be performed by judges outside of the modeler's own division. Models judged at the Region convention are exempt from this rule.
- All judges must sign (and print) their names on the back of the #902 form in the spaces provided.
- All documentation on the #902 form must be in ink, including scores. Any
 errors/changes made to the form <u>must be initialed</u> by both the lead judge and the
 Contest or AP chairman. In addition, a detailed explanation as to the reason for the
 change must be written on the back of the form.
- All original #901 and #902 forms will be retained by the Contest or AP chairman. Photocopies or scans of the completed forms will be returned to the modeler.

CLUB ACTIVITIES

The South Florida Railway Museum (SFRM) announced an annual award up to *\$1,000* to help a club in the Sunshine Region finance a project that provides major value and benefit for the promotion of the hobby.

It is called the Kempner Memorial Award in honor of Marvin Kempner (MMR 405) who was the Patriarch of the SFRM. Marvin visited us nearly every Saturday and provided some interesting stories of his encounters, he was 96 years old when he passed.

Applications for the award should be mailed no earlier than August 1st, and no later than September 30th.

The parameters are simple, an organization submits their request via email, or letter with the

following information and be titled the Kempner Award. (For example: Kempner Award – Organization Name Here)

Contents of the email should include the name of the organization and a brief description of the project. It should include the names, telephone numbers, and email addresses of two organization officers or members who can be reached if a question is to be asked by the selection board. These two members should also be available to receive the grant at the October convention.

The e-mail body should include a ONE-



page attachment that fully describes the project and, if it is a continuing project, describes the progress to date. It should include information on whether matching funds are available and the amount, other funding sources for the project, and the estimated total cost of the project. Include additional attachments (up to 5) for photos of the project or other ancillary information that will help the BOD to evaluate the project. Include as the last attachment a copy of your IRS 501(c)(3) determination letter if you are so equipped.

The submission should be mailed to arrive at the South Florida Railway Museum address (South Florida Railway Museum 1300 W. Hillsboro Blvd. Deerfield Beach, FL 33442

or email to <u>SFRM.ORG</u> no earlier than August 1 and no later than September 30 of the application year.
