





Treasurer's Message



Happy St Patty, Paddy or Patrick day in advance – may the green beer flow!

I hope everyone is doing well and am pleased to say that I didn't receive a single email about our financials. Either I was very clear in my article or you simply skipped the page.

In a more serious subject, we recently had a member receive an email asking for him to make a payment of \$428 on behalf of the Board. The email stated it was from our president, Andy Zimmerman!! It also stated that we would reimburse him by Friday.

This was clearly a phishing email but definitely looked legitimate until you looked closer at it. Some of the items within the email can help you identify this as fraudulent:

- 1) The Board will never ask you for money or to pay a bill on our behalf.
- 2) Look at the sender's actual email address in this case Andy's name was spoofed but the actual email address was not Andy's.
- 3) If you know Andy, he has a laundry list of titles under his name, he never uses just PRESIDENT.

Email fraudsters are getting more and more creative and with AI (artificial intelligence) are able to make these emails look really good. My rule of thumb is if I don't know the senders' email it goes to the trash. NEVER send anyone money without speaking to them personally to verify that they really need your assistance. My kids would never waste time sending me an email if they needed cash, my phone would ring asking me to Zelle them some cash (Fortunately, they are grown now so we are past those days \bigcirc).

Keep yourself safe, below are some key warning signs to look out for to identify phishing emails:

- 1. **Unexpected Sender**: Be cautious of emails from unknown or suspicious addresses, even if they look legitimate. Look at the actual senders email address is it known to you.
- 2. **Generic Greetings**: Phishing emails often use generic greetings like "Dear Customer" instead of your name.
- 3. **Urgency and Threats**: Scammers create a sense of urgency, pressuring you to act quickly, often threatening account closure or legal action.
- 4. **Spelling and Grammar Mistakes**: Look out for poor grammar, spelling errors, and awkward phrasing.
- 5. **Suspicious Links and Attachments**: Hover over links to see the actual URL before clicking. Be wary of unexpected attachments.
- 6. **Requests for Sensitive Information**: Legitimate companies won't ask for sensitive information via email.
- 7. **Unusual Requests**: Be cautious if the email asks you to verify your account or update your password through a link.
- 8. **Mismatched URLs**: Check if the URL in the email matches the official website of the company. Phishers often use similar-looking URLs to trick you.

If you ever suspect an email is a phishing attempt, it's best to avoid clicking on any links or downloading attachments. Instead, contact the company directly using their official contact information.

Stay safe out there! If you have any more questions or need further assistance, feel free to ask.

Achievement Program



We have one (1) AP for the month, and it is. Kevin Page Sr. for Model Railroad Engineer Electrical from Ponte Vedra, Florida from the Northern Division.

I made a mistake last month in the listing of the Achievement Program Statement of Qualifications with Master Builder Cars and it should have been Master builder Structures.

So, this month lets continue with the Achievement Program Statement of Qualifications with Achievement Program Master Builder Scenery.

To qualify for this certificate, you must:

- 1. Construct a completed section of a model railroad of at least sixty (60) scale feet in O scale, or forty-five (45) square feet in S scale, or thirty-two square feet in HO scale, or eighteen (18) square feet in N scale or other scales in proportional relationship to HO scale. This completed section must contain the necessary scenic elements of terrain, structures, background, lighting, ad realism/conformity as combined to achieve a realistic effect using applicable NMRA standards in that particular model railroad scene. The intent of this category is the prototypical rendering of the scenic elements from the ground up. The definitions of the various elements (which may be combined to combined to comprise the setting for the model railroad) shall be.
 - TERRAIN- The ground and all natural features such as rocks, water, trees, hills and depressions as well as manmade features such as the railroad roadbed, cuts, fills, drainage ditches, embankments, streets and roads.
 - STRUCTURES- Structures are considered from the standpoint of prototypical suitability, placement and appearance as scenic elements. (The quality of construction is covered under the Master Builder Structures category). Structures include bridges, trestles, culverts, buildings and all other types of structures (towers, power lines, signs, fences, etc.), track and right-of-way appurtenances (such as turnout controls, signaling structures, crossing gates and shanties etc.), turntables and other service structures. The items described above are a few examples and additional features are encouraged.
 - BACKGROUND- Treatment of wall, backdrop or ceiling to realistically depict depth and distance horizon and sky.
 - LIGHTING- Illumination effects from three (3) aspects: railroad cars and signals, etc.: buildings, streets and roads, etc.: overall lighting effects- day and /or night. An entirely daylight scene is acceptable. This lighting information must be included in the material prepared for Section four (4) below.
 - REALISM/CONFORMITY- General overall impression that the scene is a believable, miniature representation of prototype railroad.
- 2. Prepare a set of photographs or a video and a written description clearly describing the intent setting of the model railroad and the scenic details including towns or cities in the area being evaluated.
- 3. Prepare a description of the materials and methods of construction used in the creating various features of terrain, background, and lighting.

- 4. Attach a copy of materials in section 2&3 to the Statement of Qualifications for use by the evaluators in determining the effectiveness of the craftsmanship displayed by the member requesting certification.
- 5. Earn a Merit Award of at least *&.5 points on the section of the layout being evaluated.
- 6. Submit a completed Statement of Qualifications (SOQ) including the attachments for Sections 2 & 3 and the signed Merit Evaluation forms from Section 5.

That is all I have for this time around.

Now that the holiday season is behind us, the frequency of club events is decreasing although not gone altogether. So, I thought I would diverge a bit this month to discuss the various club layouts in the Southern Division, since I had the opportunity to visit some of them recently.

First, I'll provide the current updates in club news. The Florida Citrus Model Train Society (FCMTS) plans to reopen their display at the Plantation Museum in July 2025 although the specific dates are not finalized. The East Coast HO Exhibitors Society (ECHOES) club is continuing to prepare a room at the Gold Coast Railroad Museum, with the immediate goal of moving their modular layout into the facility, the club estimates that another 2 months of effort is required to prepare that space. It will be slowly replaced by a permanent layout, freeing up the modular layout to travel to shows and conventions. The club has tentatively scheduled a running session for March 28-30th, once again at the St. Andrews church at 14260 Old Cutler Road, Miami. The Palm Beach Model Railroaders completed their intense 17 days of open houses during the Palm Beach County fair and the club is winding down from that before planning additional events. The club meets weekly on Tuesday evenings 6-9 PM at the South Florida Fairgrounds, 9067 Southern Blvd, West Palm Beach, 33411. They can be contacted at PBMRRclub@gmail.com for additional information. The South Florida Railway Museum (SFRM) at the Deerfield Amtrak and Tri-Rail station on Hillsboro Road plans their next open house on March 8th with visitors welcomed from 11 AM through 4 PM. The club maintains a Facebook page in lieu of a web site. For additional information, contact Bob Leonard, leonardstrait@gmail.com.

Now on to discussion of the club layouts. The ECHOES club layout is a modular HO scale layout with dual mainlines. The layout includes a yard that is set up to assemble trains to go in either direction on the mainline, and there is a junction module that leads to another multitrack section designed to set up and remove trains from the layout. The modules include sidings and industries that support more intense operating sessions when not being used in continuous loop display mode at shows. During formal operating sessions, each train runs with a two-man crew and switch lists are generated to support switching moves during the session. The layout ran completely reliability during the time I attended, attesting to good maintenance.

The Palm Beach Model Railroaders club layout is a permanent HO layout that has been operating for 50 years and is continuously maintained and enhanced. With that long history, it's no surprise that some sophisticated features have been incorporated. For operations, there is a computer-controlled dispatchers station half a floor above the layout to provide a good view. The screen has full information about what is occurring on the layout, including the location of each train. There is a marvelous motorized lift bridge to enter the layout that includes train detection so you cannot open the bridge when a train is closing in on it. The incredible reliability of this bridge structure is in part due

to the full steel construction of the bridge underside, eliminating the problems of warping. The layout includes a full backdrop and there are computer-controlled lighting and sound effects that allow for thunderstorms and even fireworks shows. The effect is dramatic and a true crowd pleaser when opened to the public. The layout also includes several trains running in point-to-point mode just to add interest. I visited there during the Palm Beach County Fair for over 8 hours and was very impressed that the two mainline trains running on the dual mainline never faltered or derailed during that entire period.

The SFRM club has two permanent layouts, one in HO and the other in N scale. The HO scale layout is themed to a location somewhere in Appalachia which aids in its implementation using a helix to traverse between the main layout level, an upper level, and staging on a lower level. A very picturesque canyon surrounds one side of the helix. The main level features an engine terminal that is nearing completion. The N scale layout is themed roughly to the state of Florida. It has an elevated city on one end with a large passenger terminal and several animation features. The other end features a port with a large container ship, the perfect location for intermodal traffic. Next to that is a large Tropicana plant.

All of these club layouts are worth the visit, so if you have a chance look into going to seeing them in 2025. Check the club web sites for information on open sessions and locations.

I will be traveling next month, so my predecessor, Bob Leonard will jump in to provide the column for April. Thanks in advance, Bob!

That's all for now. Let's make 2025 a great year for model railroading.

UPCOMING EVENTS

On Saturday, April 26th, 2025, at 10:30AM, the Western Division will be hosting a free guided tour of the Mulberry Phosphate Museum in the Historic Mulberry Railroad Depot, in Mulberry FL. The city of Mulberry is known as the Phosphate Capital of the world and the Museum is located at: 101 SE First St., Mulberry, FL 33860.

The Museum houses an outstanding collection of fossilized remains, area memorabilia and educational exhibits on the phosphate industry. There is a 44-yard drag line pile where visitors can dig in and look for sharks' teeth and prehistoric animal remains and what you find you can keep, so don't forget your shovel and bucket. Also, there is an 1880s Manchester 4-4-0 Locomotive and a Seaboard Coast Line Caboose. The locomotive was thought to be buried around the 1930s and spent almost 80 years underground before being found in 2012.

In the first Phosphate Gallery, visitors will learn all about the Phosphate industry and how it is essential to our world today. The Fossil Gallery is in the Mulberry Historic Train Depot and is home to a Prehistoric Fossil collection that was acquired from the Bone Valley Fossil Collection in Bradley, FL. Fossils of sea and land creatures include whales, dolphins, sharks, land creatures such as tortoises, rhinos, giraffes and arrowheads, all dating back millions of years. Your visit will also be an introduction to the relationship of animals remains with the modern-day Phosphate Industry.

If you would like to go on the free guided tour, email or call me so I can add you to the list.

On Saturday, May 10th, 2025, there will be a Northern Division Meet at the West Branch Lake City Library, in Lake City. Three (3) Clinics will be presented, and the doors open at 10AM, along with coffee and donuts. Also, if we have time, Allan Scott will open his layout to attendees. 
