
I really wish I would have done so many things differently with my children in regards to sharing something that has been, and still is, such a huge part of my life. But I have BIG plans in store for my future grandkids!



## **Revised Judging Guidelines**



To be a judge you must meet the following criteria:

- All judges must attend Judging 101 class.
- Lead judges must attend both Judging 101 and 102 classes
- All AP judging to be performed by judges outside of the modeler's own division. Models judged at the Region convention are exempt from this rule.
- All judges must sign (and print) their names on the back of the #902 form in the spaces provided.
- All documentation on the#902 form must be in ink, including scores. Any
  errors/changes made to the form must be initialed by both the lead judge and the
  Contest or AP chairman. In addition, a detailed explanation as to the reason for the
  change must be written on the back of the form.

• All original #901 and #902 forms will be retained by the Contest or AP chairman. Photocopies of the completed forms will be returned to the modeler.



On Saturday, April 20, I attended the Western Division's one-day meet in Davenport (Polk Co.) Hosted by Tom Wilson, the meet featured four clinics/presentations and attracted 20 attendees. It was a pleasure to meet and chat with fellow SSR members.

The NMRA Achievement Program (AP) provides an incentive to learn and master several of the skills associated with model railroading including scenery, rolling stock, track work, and electrical. There are eleven skill areas, each of which leads to award of an Achievement Certificate. Proficiency in seven areas qualifies applicants for the Master Model Railroader (MMR) designation. Am putting the call out to all model railroad clubs located within the Eastern Division. Recently cleared some space on the "work bench" to assemble a small fleet of Accurail HO scale 50-ton steel hoppers. The prototype was designed by the United States Railway Administration during the First World War to incorporate a "standardized" design and to meet the nation's coal transport needs. It's considered to be one of the most enduring car designs of the first half of the Twentieth Century. In all, approximately 22,000 cars were delivered by the USRA to 23 railroads. Accurail produced two versions: 2400-series with Andrews trucks and 2500-series with "Bettendorf" style trucks.

While Accurail offered this attractive model in a variety of road names, I chose to start with undecorated versions. Across the years several articles have appeared in the hobby press as well as online describing potential USRA twin-hopper upgrade options.

For my fleet of eight USRA twin hoppers, I opted to paint four cars in PRR FCR (as stand-ins for GLa class cars with Circle Keystone emblems) and four black (decaled for NYC and various Pennsylvania short lines). To do so, I used Tamiya paint and K4 decals.


