## Eastern Division



Greetings.

Getting started in the model railroading hobby can be both exciting and, at times, daunting. There are so many new and interesting products available for purchase; and so many new techniques and skills to learn. As a beginner, it is often possible to lose track of one's progress toward a desired goal or objective. To stay on track, I've adopted two tactics. The first is Bob Leonard's (Superintendent -Sothern Division) 60-minute guideline. Following completion of my post-dinner chores, it's off to my "workbench" for a dedicated hour-long "work" session. Depending on the task at hand, these sessions have been known to expand to multiple hours. Second, my "work diary". Much of my professional life has been project-focused, typically where large –and often complex – projects are dissected into a series of more clearly defined individual steps. And so, too, is with my approach to model railroading. Employing a "dollar store" notebook or diary, I chronicle both work completed and work planned. This effort requires but a few minutes, and helps ensure any materials needed to support further progress have been identified and ordered.

While its likely each SSR member has their own approach, as someone new to the hobby, I (consciously) vary my focus between rolling stock, structures, and layout activities. Within the last several weeks, I assembled, painted, and decaled several open-top hoppers and wooden reefers. This was followed by a structure kit bash and my first attempt at scratch-building. (A tip regarding the latter: start with cardstock mockups.) Taken collectively, this approach has maintained my enthusiasm for the hobby while avoiding getting bored by task repetition (for example, brush painting freight car wheels).

One of the cornerstone tenets of our hobby is fellowship. Given my professional and and personal responsibilities, I'm not able to attend as many model railroading activities or events as I would like. Therefore, in support of my goal of meeting as many Eastern Division members as practical, I have relied on one-on-one meets, personal emails, and occasionally phone calls. In doing so, I have engaged approximately one-quarter of the Eastern Division's membership. Like any population, some members are currently active in the hobby, while others are "taking a break" or "retired".

Still, it has revealed an interesting microcosm of model railroading in Florida in 2024. Not only have I gained insight into individual member interests and priorities, I have also benefited from their experience and advice. (Case in point: Thank you, Dave Davies, for "interpreting" the various parts sprues within a Tichy tank car kit.)

In closing, Sunshine Region members will soon have the opportunity (October 10 – 13, 2024) to join together as part of the Region's annual convention. Based on preliminary information, I look forward to the new venue (Ocala) and the slate of planned activities and clinics. I hope many of you are also planning to attend; and I look forward to visiting with you.

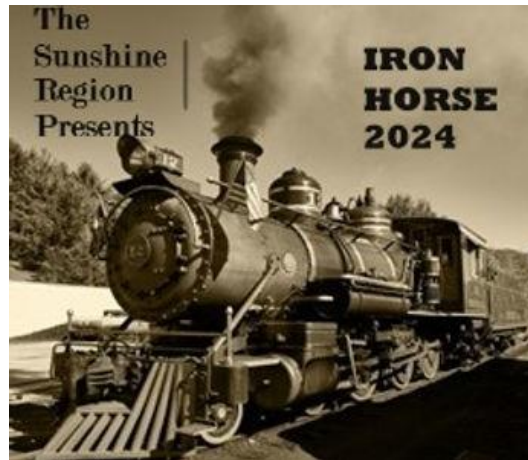

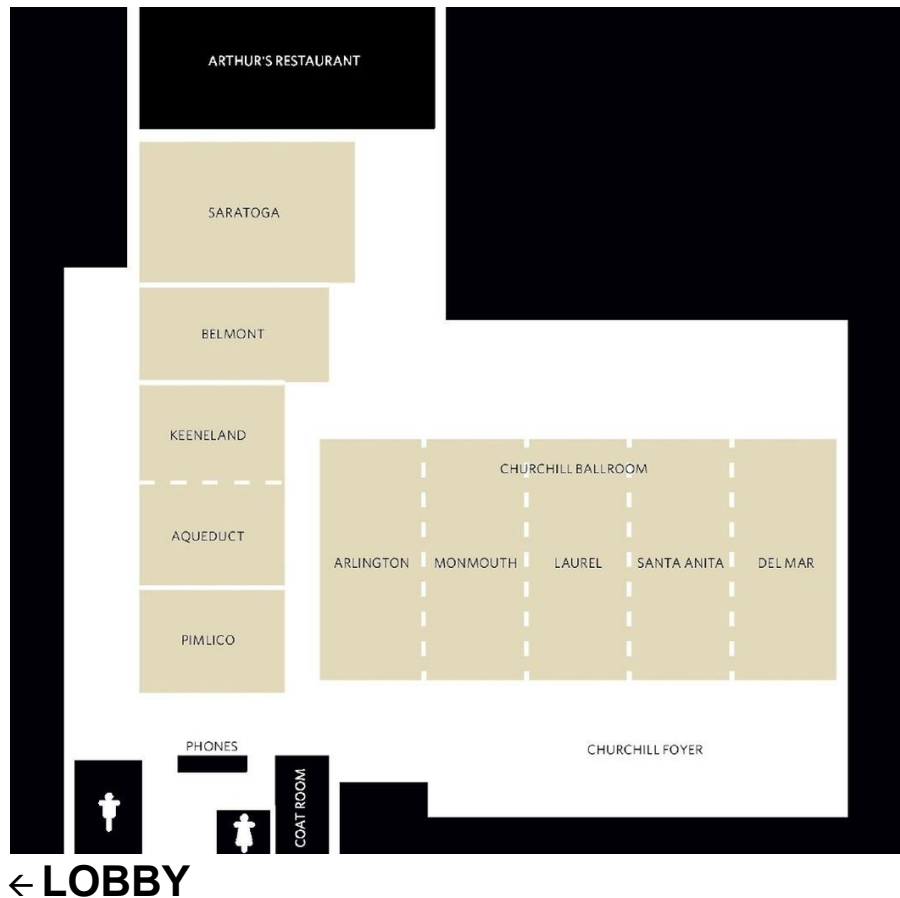
## Convention Hotel - Hilton Ocala

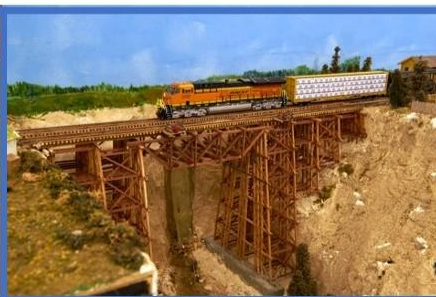
